

Reflections of the Life of Mrs. Annie Lee Sanders Hollis

Mrs. Annie Lee Sanders Hollis entered into eternal rest on Friday, May 19, 2023, at the age of 91, in Columbia, SC. She was born on October 10, 1931 to Nancy (Wilkes) and Estell Sanders in Sharon, South Carolina, and later moved to York, South Carolina. She was the eldest of fifteen children. After the passing of her mother, Annie became the family matriarch and was affectionately known as "The Boss." She led her family with kindness, compassion, and love.

Ann was a phenomenal student. After graduating from Jefferson High School, she earned her Bachelor of Arts Degree in English, from Barber-Scotia College in Concord, North Carolina. With a desire to be a college professor, Ann earned her Master's in English from Howard University, in Washington, DC.

She met the love of her life, Benjamin Hollis, while working at Harbison Junior College. On December 21, 1957, she married her soulmate. They were married for 50 years until Ben passed in 2008. This union was blessed with two daughters, Benita Lynn, and Jennifer Ann Hollis.

Ann was a brilliant English professor at several colleges and universities; most notably at Voorhees College, Virginia Union University, Allen University, and Benedict College. She retired in 1998 from Midlands Technical College but continued her love for learning and educating through various cultural programs. Ann's passion for the literary arts led her to establish one of the first African American performing art studios in Columbia, SC. The Jenny Lynn Studio of Performing Arts offered drama, dance, modeling, etiquette and martial-arts classes. Her vision and creativity allowed others to see the gifts in themselves and express them through the arts. Each year culminated with a production and banquet that showcased the array of talents of her beloved students and instructors.

She was an ordained deacon at Northminster Presbyterian Church, in Columbia, SC, and an active member of the Presbyterian Women. She loved her church family dearly and served faithfully in numerous positions, but what brought her the most joy was serving with the Drama Ministry, where the Word of God was brought to life through plays and musicals.

Ann was known for her beauty and ageless sense of style and fashion. Her wardrobe was immaculate and featured an extensive hat collection that was fit for a queen. Her choice of outfits, hats and accessories were colorful with elegant embellishments. When teased that she was too old to wear them, she simply replied, "style has no age."

In addition to her parents, Ann was predeceased by her husband, Benjamin Hollis, Elois Sanders Wilson (sister), Elizabeth Burton (cousin reared in the home), Ted Lewis Sanders, Leroy Sanders, Arthur Allen Sanders, and Samuel Sanders (brothers).
