

## Obituary

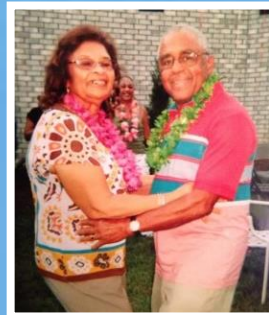
Mr. Solomon Norman Werdenie was born on July 9, 1929, in Kingston, Jamaica. He departed this life on Wednesday, May 3, 2023.

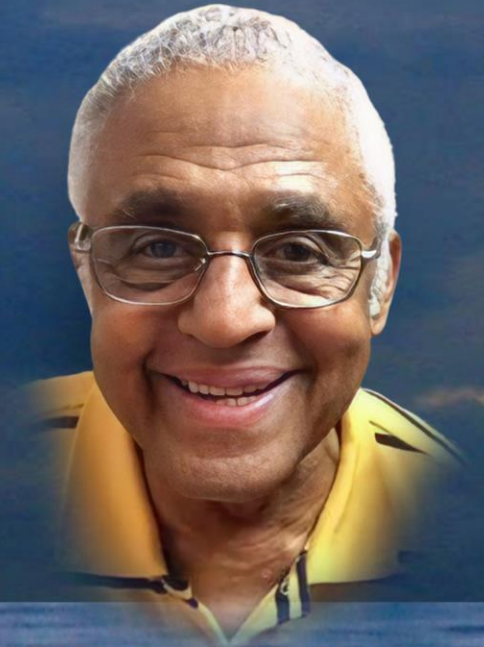
