Mrs. Manatha Moton Young was born in Demopolis, Alabama on July 5, 1929, to Solomon and Ada Moton. She quietly departed this life from her earthly home on Saturday, June 17, 2023. Manatha was educated in the public schools of Marengo County and graduated from Jones High School, Demopolis, Alabama. She continued her education and received a Bachelor of Science Degree from Alabama State University, in Montgomery, Alabama. She also earned a master's degree from Indiana University.

Manatha was joined in holy matrimony to Dr. Alfred F. Young, on June 16, 1956, and to their union two children were born. She taught at Carver High School, in Montgomery, Alabama, before moving to Columbia, South Carolina in 1963, where she began teaching at Benedict College for 34 years. Manatha also served on the Board of Trustees.

She was a member of Dexter Avenue Baptist Church, in Montgomery, Alabama and her Pastor was the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Upon moving to Columbia, South Carolina she joined Second Calvary Baptist Church, where she served as a Deaconess, a regular Bible Study attendee, a member of the Pulpit Aid, a member of the Education Advancement Awards Committee, and a member of the Trustee Committee, retiring in 2021 as Trustee Emeritus.

She was a "VERY" proud, Life Member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated. She was awarded the Odessa Nelson Graduate Advisor Award from Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated South Atlantic Region and served for several years as a Graduate Advisor for Psi Chapter at Benedict College. She was chosen as "Member of the Year" for 2022, from the Gamma Nu Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated and she continued to be an important and active member until her death.

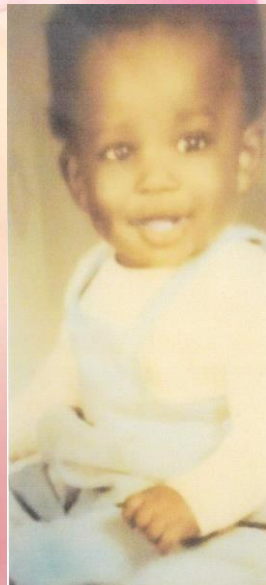
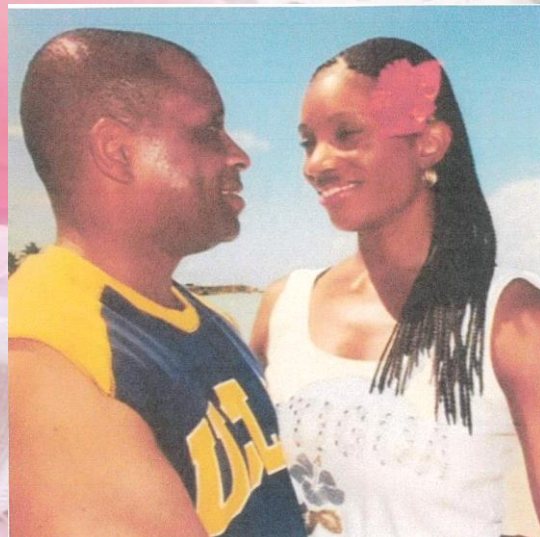
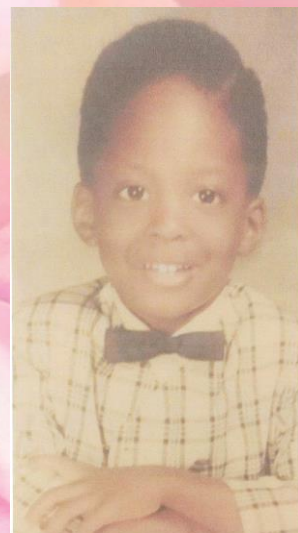
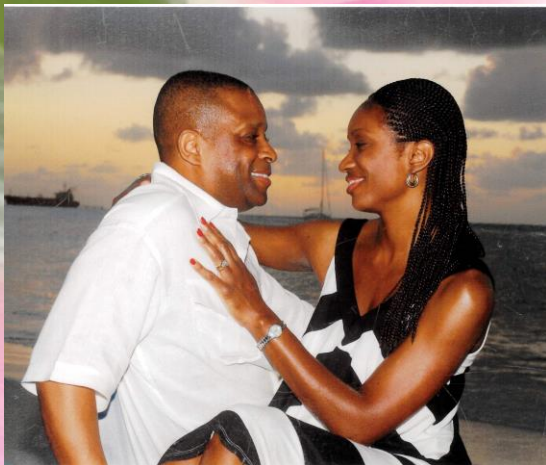
