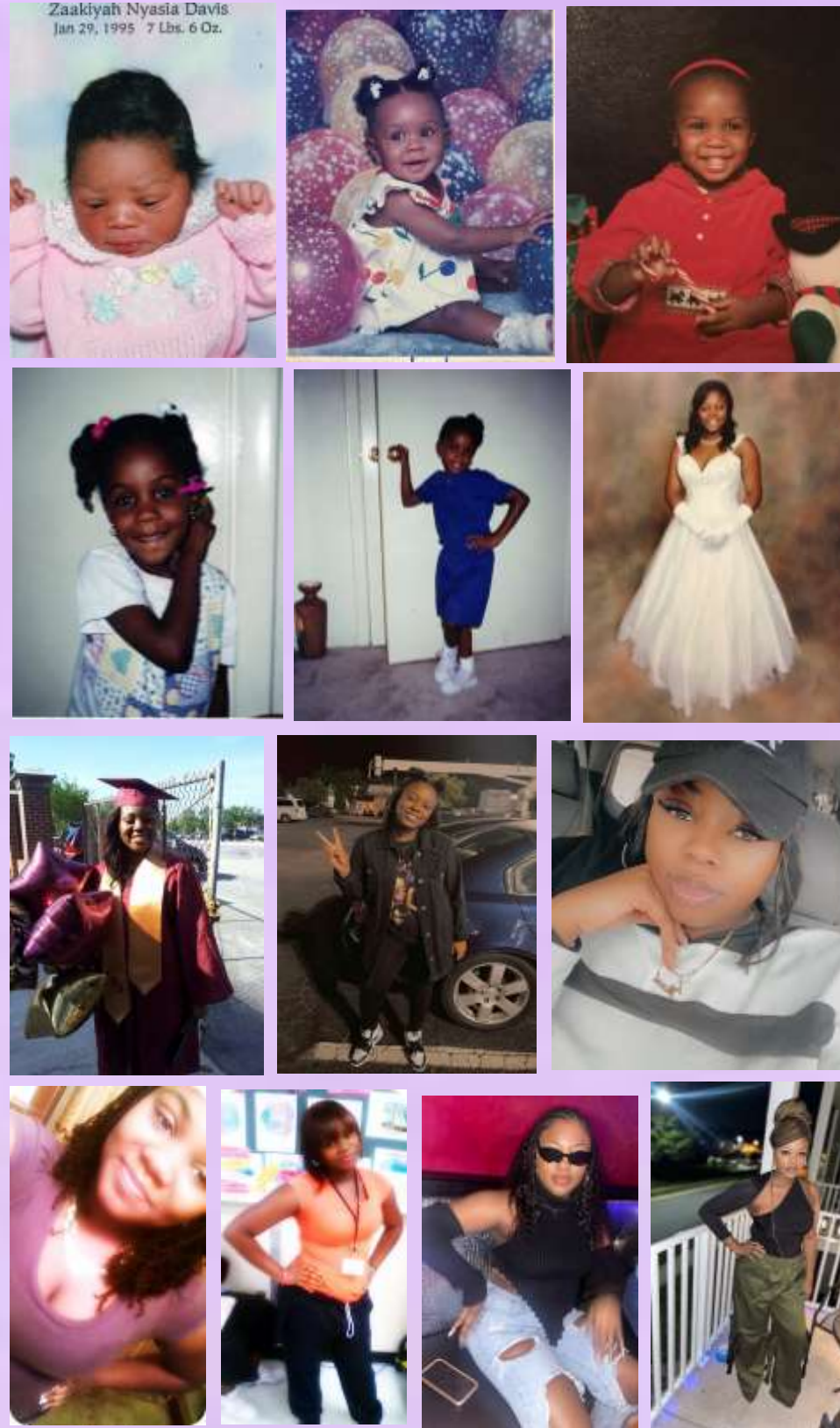
# Life's Reflections of Ms. Zaakiyah NyAsia Davis
