Miss Me - But Let Me Go.*

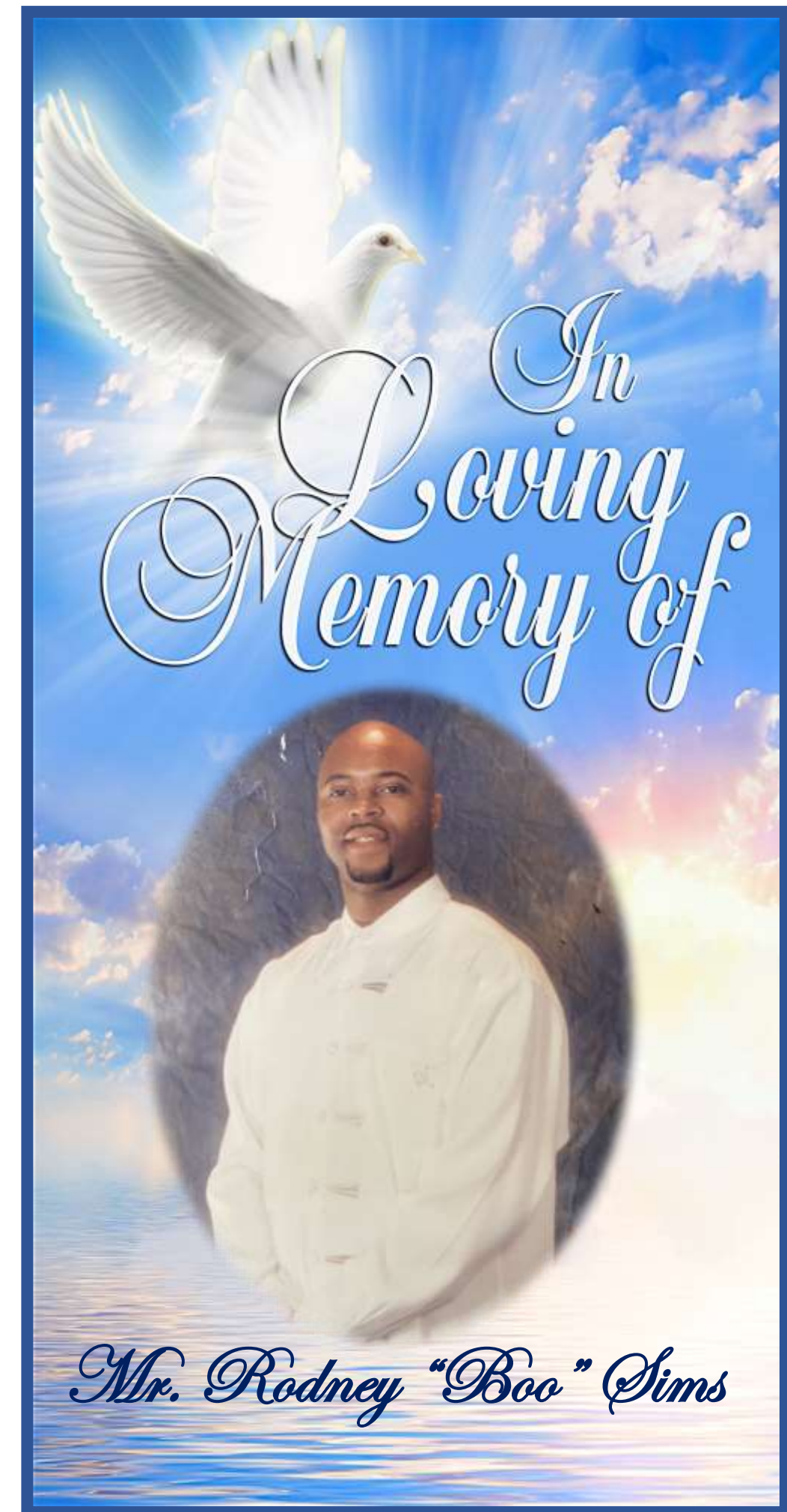
