



Senator John L. Scott, Jr.

Serving the 19<sup>th</sup> Senate District since 2008, Senator Scott's focus has been promoting economic development, improving internet access, HBCUs, Fiscal Policy, fixing the State's crumbling infrastructure, supporting veterans and promoting workforce development through Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) programs. His service to South Carolina spans for 32 years and prior to being elected to the South Carolina General Assembly, he served on the Richland County Council as its Vice-Chair for 2 years. In 1990, he was elected to the House of Representatives and served for 18 years before being elected as a State Senator in 2008. As Senator, he was a member of the Senate Finance Committee, the Labor Commerce and Industry Committee, the Rules, and the Medical Affairs Committee.

While serving in the House of Representatives, he championed legislation for the new voting system, the state-run lottery, and the early voting process. He participated in the District's Reapportionment Process during his tenure in both the House and the Senate. After joining the Senate, he worked, successfully, to pass a bill to repair and rebuild the State's crumbling roads and bridges and to make them safer for all South Carolinians. Being a strong proponent for education, he led the fight in securing funding for deteriorating buildings for K-12 Education, worked to secure \$15M loan for South Carolina State University and fought and secured the first \$1M H.E.E.P. funding for South Carolina's HBCUs.

Senator Scott has served on several boards and received numerous awards and recognitions. To mention, in 2002, he was awarded South Carolina's Highest Civilian Honor, The Order of the Palmetto. Other awards included: the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Drum Major for Justice Award, 2008, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Humanitarian Award, 2009, Keeper of the Flame Award, 2016, named Legislative Champion of South Carolina's Independent Colleges and Universities, 2017, S.C. Legislative Black Caucus Ernest Finney Chairman Award, 2018. He received a Doctorate of Humane Letters, from Clinton College in 2018. He, also, received the Presidential Service Award in 2019. In 2019, he was chosen by the members of South Carolina's Democratic Caucus to give the Democratic Response to the State of the State Address by Governor Henry McMaster.

In 2020, he received an Honorary Doctorate of Public Service from South Carolina State University and in 2020, he received the "Allen University Richard Allen Award."

In 2021, Senator Scott's vision came to fruition with the launching of South Carolina Institutes of Innovation, when he, successfully, secured an appropriation of \$18 million dollars for South Carolina's seven HBCU's to assist them in developing innovative programs and partnerships with the local and state businesses and industries.

In 2022, he was recognized by HBCU Times magazine for revolutionizing South Carolina's History of Black Colleges and Universities through the South Carolina Institutes of Innovation and Information. He was named among Columbia's Business Weekly as one of "Columbia's 50 Most Influential for Outstanding Contributions to the Greater Columbia Community." In 2022, he was inducted into the C.A. Johnson High School Wall of Fame. Most recently he received the Anderson County SC Democratic Party Living Legend Award and was recognized as the Manufactured Housing Institute Legislator of South Carolina.

Senator Scott served on the Advisory Board for the Midlands Coalition of Churches, a non-profit organization made up non-denominational churches both county and statewide.

He contributed to several community projects and made periodic donations to their fundraisers. He organized and developed a food distribution program that served over three-thousand people locally during COVID and this effort also included the Greenville, SC area.

He holds a Bachelor of Science degree, with a Minor in Economics from South Carolina State University, Doctorate of Humane Letters from Clinton College, and was a graduate of the Diversity Leadership Academy at the Richard E. Riley Institute at Furman University. Senator Scott, proudly, retired as Major General from the South Carolina Military Department Joint Service Detachment in 2019; and was a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. among several other professional organizations.

He became a member of the New Ebenezer Baptist Church at a very early age. He served in numerous capacities on several ministries over the years. He was a Trustee for twenty years and served as an Ordained Deacon since 2005. Deacon John L. Scott, Jr. served New Ebenezer in monumental ways, and he was instrumental in the church's acquisition of over 100 acres of land and positioned the church to continue its legacy.

Senator Scott is Founder/Owner and Broker in Charge of J.L. Scott Realty Company, Inc. and is Co-Owner of the C & S Consulting Group, Inc. along with his wife, Joan. Senator Scott was a car enthusiast who shared a passion with lovers of vintage and classic cars and was a member of the Carolina Car Club and the Midlands Cruisers. He loved his Jack Russell Terrier, MAXX!! Senator Scott loved his neighbors and believed in living peaceably with everyone.
