Obituary of Ms. Geraldine D. Green Bedenbaugh

Ms. Geraldine D. Green Bedenbaugh was born June 2, 1942, to the late Jeremiah Green and Annie Bell Shepard Green, in Columbia, SC. She received her wings on Friday, September 29, 2023, at home.

At the early age of 10, Geraldine (Gerri) was baptized. She became a faithful and devoted servant of Christ at Trinity Baptist Church (TBC), currently under the leadership of Reverend Dr. Thurmond Bowens, Jr. During her tenure and years of membership, Geraldine served as Trustee and later became the second female Chairperson of the Trustee Ministry (2001-2017), culminating over 40 years of service.
