Life Reflections of **Reverend Israel Gist**

Reverend Israel Gist was born in Pauline, South Carolina. He was one of 10 children born to the late Reverend Avant Gist and Mrs. Fannie Moore Gist.

He was baptized at an early age at New Trinity Baptist Church in Wellford, South Carolina. Reverend Gist attended the public school of Spartanburg County. He graduated from Florence Chapel High School in Wellford, South Carolina. In high school, the sport Reverend Gist enjoyed the most was basketball (Upper State MVP Class A Colored Schools) during his senior year. After graduating high school, he served in the United States Navy and was honorably discharged in 1955.

He later received a full baseball scholarship to attend Allen University in Columbia, South Carolina. Reverend Gist was the starting first baseman for four straight years and was a member of the only two Allen University's baseball teams that won the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) Championship. He was also a member of the Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society, Who's Who in American Universities and Colleges, and served as the student body president. In November 2010, Reverend Gist was inducted into the Allen University Athletic Hall of Fame for his outstanding performance in baseball and as a student leader. He was the proud life member #796 of the Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity. After graduating with honors, Reverend Gist worked for the University for a year and then relocated to New York where he was employed by the United States Postal Service and the U.S. Department of Customs. He was recognized as one of the oldest Kappa's in 2021.

After returning to South Carolina he was employed by the Internal Revenue Service and then the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, where he retired from in 1994 as Chief of the Field Section for the Columbia Regional Office. He was employed by the Federal Government for 32 years, nine months, and two days. After retirement, Reverend Gist worked for the South Carolina State Retirement Systems as a counselor and worked for the Richland/Lexington School District 5 as a substitute teacher for many years. He was licensed to preach the gospel in 2010. Reverend Gist was ordained on January 12, 2013 by the Gethsemane Baptist Association of South Carolina. He served as one of the associate ministers at Zion Baptist Church in Columbia, South Carolina. He also served as the minister of seniors. He enjoyed playing golf and over the years he has won more than 55 trophies and awards playing competitively. During his golfing career, his handicap was less than two. Reverend Gist spent most of his leisure time studying the Bible, visit family, watching TV, and shopping.

Reverend Gist was predeceased by his parents, sisters, Grace Gist Williams, Fannie Gist Pearson, Betty Jean Gist, and Annie Lee Gist; brothers, Reverend J.C Gist, Romie Gist and Avant Gist; and son, Sidney Gist.

Reverend Gist is survived by his wife of 38 years, Cynthia Owens Gist, of Irmo, SC; daughters, Yvette Gist, of Columbia, SC and Brittney NiChole Gist, of Columbia; son, Yul Gist, of Columbia, SC; sister, Laura Gist Cates, of Wellford, SC; brother, J'vant Gist (Penny), of Wellford, SC; a grandson, Tristan Ryan Adrian Xaviar Gist, Sr.; a great-grandson, Tristan Ryan Adrian Xaviar Gist, Jr.; and a host of nieces, nephews, many other loving, and caring friends, all of whom will miss you dearly.
