Obituary of Mr. Harvey DiAngelo Jones

Mr. Harvey DiAngelo Jones was born on October 12, 1976, in Columbia, South Carolina. He was the youngest son of Mr. Harvey Jones and Mrs. Patricia Sullivan. Harvey departed this life on Wednesday, October 18, 2023.

Harvey was not only an articulate speaker, but he was a gifted poet with an innate ability to use words to bring stories, perspectives, and people to life. He received his public education and high school diploma from schools within Richland County School District One in Columbia, South Carolina. Harvey lived in Mill Creek Estates, in Columbia, South Carolina during his entire childhood. As he grew, the neighborhood became a close-knit family. Upon his graduation, Harvey pursued his undergraduate education at Florida A&M University, in Tallahassee, Florida.

Harvey was fond of Tallahassee, but would later transition to Atlanta, Georgia. It was a city that he would come to love and a place where he would spend most of his adult years. As an adult, Harvey also informally changed his name to Jelani (which means strong, great, or mighty) Alimayu (which means in honor of God). While Harvey authored numerous poems, he would publish his first book, "Starbucks and Black Me: Where White Cream and Black Coffee Conflict" in 2018.

Without question, Harvey left his mark on this world. Harvey was preceded in death by his grandparents; Reverend Mac Robinson, Mr. Harry Wells Sullivan, Mr. James and Mrs. Frances McKinney, and Mrs. Rosa Scott Jones; his older brother, Mr. Doran Jones, and his son, Mossi Kodjoe Jones.

Harvey leaves to cherish his memory: his father, Harvey Jones; his mother, Patricia Sullivan, both of Columbia, South Carolina; a daughter, Oyin Batemon-Jones; a stepson that he loved as his own, Ameer Harley, both of Atlanta, Georgia; the mother of his children, Imahni Batemon, of Atlanta, Georgia; his sister, Yasha Jones Becton (Gary), of Blythewood, South Carolina; one nephew, Dorian Jones; two nieces, Angel Jones and Yari Jones; a host of uncles, aunts, cousins; many other loving relatives and caring friends all of whom will miss him dearly.
