

Mr. Anthony Steven Kent, Sr. was born January 6, 1959, in James Island (Charleston), SC, to the late Phillip Daniel Kent, Sr. and Delores Eady Richardson. He departed this life peacefully with his wife holding his hand on Thursday, September 28, 2023, at Prisma Heart Hospital due to heart failure.

Anthony was baptized at Greater St. Luke Baptist Church, where his family worshiped together for many years. Anthony was educated in the Charleston, SC public school system, where he graduated from James Island High School in 1977. His record in track and field is still undefeated in the 200 meter, 400 meter, and triple jump. They won the state championship with only 7 people on the team. In 1980, he enlisted the United States Army and served his country honorably for five years.

"Kent" was a Master Welder for over 35 years. He was certified in flux core welding, stainless steel, arc-welding, shield metal arc, and gas metal arc welding. He also had extensive experience in the design fabrication and operation of commercial nuclear systems such as waste-water tanks and industrial applications. "Kent" was also an excellent carpenter; he liked to design and do woodwork, installing and staining goods, painting, plumbing, and electrical work. He enjoyed cooking big meals for family and friends, taking trips, going to the amusement park, and the beach.

In addition to his parents, "Kent" was preceded in death by his brother, Phillip Daniel Kent, Jr.
















