She accepted Christ at a young age and was affiliated with the Thankful Baptist Church, in Savannah, Georgia. She transitioned from time to eternity about 2 o'clock a.m. on Tuesday, October 17, 2023. Hours before this unanticipated moment, she uttered a sincere prayer to God about the complications that developed following a hospital surgical procedure.
