

# Reflections of the Life of Major (Ret.) Ivry Moon, Jr.

Major (Ret.) Ivry Moon, Jr. was born on March 19, 1944, in Columbia, SC to the late Pauline Bookman Moon and Ira Wesley Moon. He departed this earthly life to be with the Lord on Friday, November 3, 2023, at the Prisma Health Richland Heart Center.

Ivry attended C.A. Johnson High School and graduated in 1965. After graduation he enlisted in the United States Air Force and served 11 years enlisted and 13 years commissioned. He retired in August 1989 at the rank of Major. He received numerous achievements, awards and recognitions while serving in the United States Air Force from 1965 to 1989. Some of these included Officer of the Quarter (numerous times) and Officer of the Year – 1978.

His military awards include: Meritorious Service Medal, Air Force Commendation Medals, Air Force Achievement Medal, Air Force Outstanding Unit Award, Air Force Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service and Campaign Medal, and Air Force Training Ribbon. Ivry traveled and served in 17 countries (such as Thailand, Japan, Philippines, Germany, Norway, Spain, Greece, England, Italy, Turkey, and Saudi Arabia) and 43 States. His last military assignment was Assistant Professor of Aerospace Studies, Commandant of Cadets, Detachment 775, Air Force ROTC, University of South Carolina, Columbia, SC, July 1986 – August 1989.

After retiring from the United States Air Force, Ivry started working for the SC Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) as the Division Director of Procurement Services and Minority Business Coordinator. He retired from that position in April 2009 after 19 years.

Ivry earned several degrees and certificates to include: an Associate Degree in Accounting, Midlands Technical College, Columbia, SC., 1972; Bachelor's of Arts Degree in Business Administration, Auburn University, Auburn, AL., 1976; Master's Degree in Logistics Management, Air Force Institute of Technology, Dayton, OH., 1981; and a Teacher Certificate, Teacher's Education Program, Elementary Education, Benedict College, Columbia, SC., 1994.

His professional community and social activities included. Former President of the C.A. Johnson High School Alumni Association (held position for 15 years 1996 – 2011); Former Director at Large, Vice President, President and Past President of the South Carolina Association of Governmental Purchasing Officials (500 Members Organization); Former Director at Large, Carolina Minority Supplier Development Council for years 2002-2005; Chairman, Trustee Ministry, Second Mazareth Baptist Church; Member, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, and formerly a Mason and Shriner.

In the 79 years that Ivry Moon lived, he was so many things to so many people. He was a son, a brother, a husband, a dad, a papa, an uncle and a friend. Ivry truly had a heart of gold, always looking out for others, lending a listening ear, and helping when needed. In his spare time, Ivry enjoyed cooking, gardening, and golfing.

Major Moon was preceded in death by his sister Vivian Bookman Smith; and two brothers Raymond Bookman and Frank Moon.
