Mr. Ernest Sumter began his journey in life on February 21, 1952, in Columbia, South Carolina. He was the youngest of four children of the late Joe Sumter and Pricilla Anderson Sumter. He departed his earthly life on Sunday, November 12, 2023.

He attended the public schools of Richland County, South Carolina and graduated from C. A. Johnson, Class of 1970. After graduation he enlisted in the United States Army on February 29, 1972.
