Deaconess Emerita, Mrs. Jeanette Gadsden Kearse, was born November 18, 1932, in Allendale, South Carolina. She was the daughter of the late Norman Gadsden and Elizabeth Dopson Gadsden. She was the eldest of three daughters. She moved into eternity to meet her Lord and Savior on Tuesday, December 12, 2023.

Mrs. Kearse was educated in the Allendale Training Schools in Allendale, SC. She graduated from Allendale Training High School, where she was Valedictorian of her class. She entered Benedict College in Columbia, SC and graduated with honors with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Elementary Education. While attending Benedict College, she was inducted into the Alpha Kappa Mu Scholastic Honor Society, became a member of Future Teachers of America and the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority. 
