

Obituary of Ms. Gloria Magbee Scott

Ms. Gloria Magbee Scott was born March 15, 1929, in New York City, New York. She was one of four children born to the late Augustus B. Magbee and Eunice Stinson Magbee. She departed this life at the age of 94, on Tuesday, January 16, 2024, at Harbison Shores Assisted Living Facility, in Irmo, South Carolina, where she resided for the last two and a half years.
