And then, when you must come this way alone, I'll greet you with a smile, and say ...

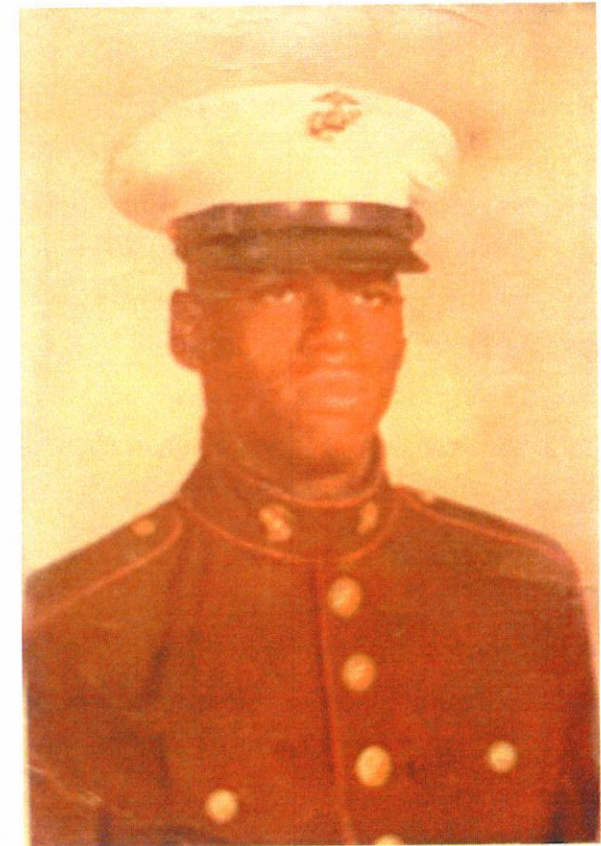
