Obituary of Mrs. Lula Goodson Daniels

Mrs. Lula Goodson Daniels was born on July 13, 1920, in Hopkins, South Carolina. She was the second oldest child of the late Napoleon B. Goodson, Sr. and Leila Randolph Goodson. She departed this earthy life on Thursday April 11, 2024, at the age of 103. Lula was educated in the public schools of Richland County, South Carolina. She was retired from Horsman Dolls in Cayce, South Carolina, where she was the first black woman in the molding department. After retirement, her desire to get back in the workforce led her to care for children. She became employed with The Children's House, where she was a Childcare Manager. Lula opened her home to everyone in the community, which was known as a place of healing.

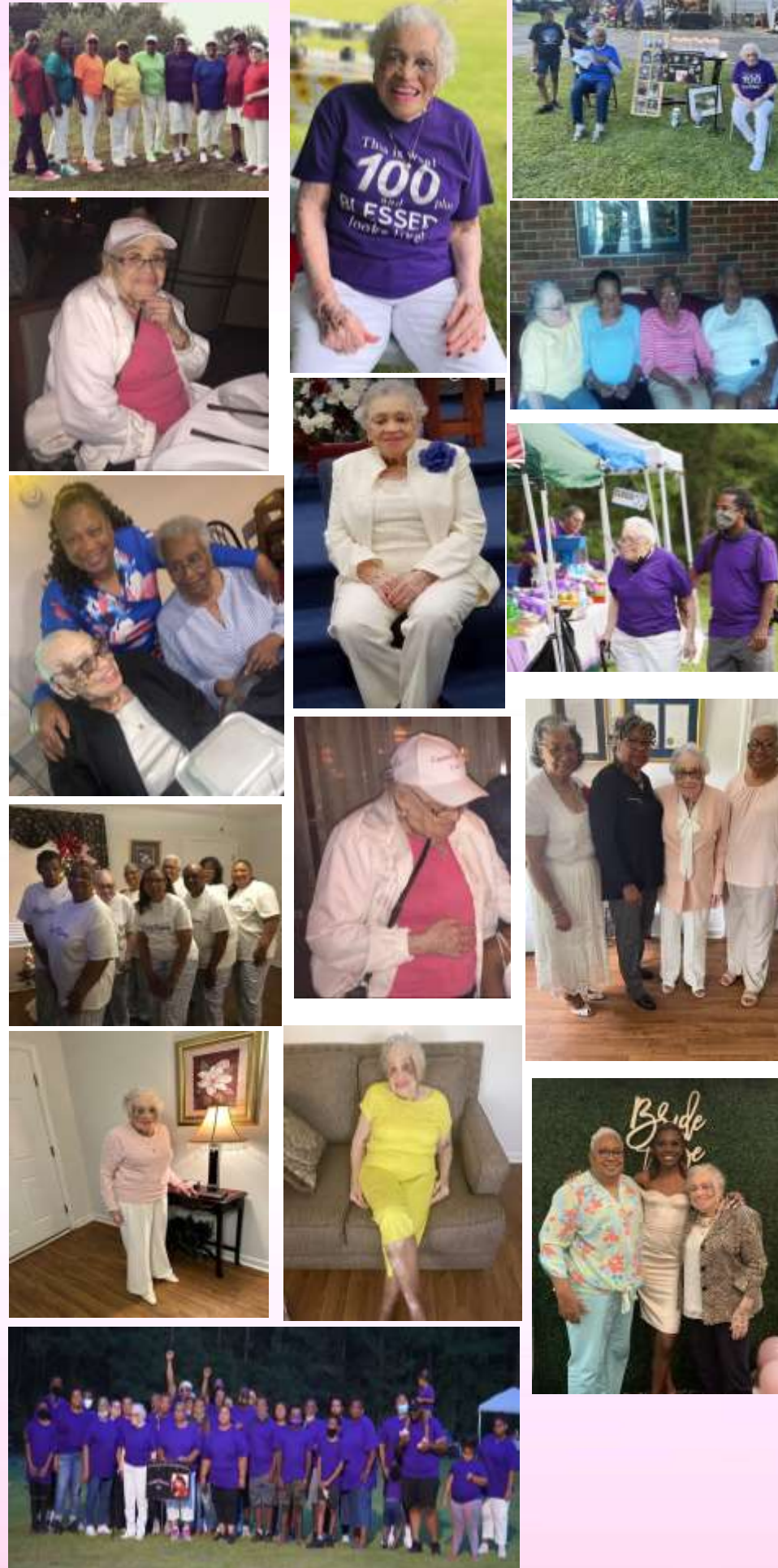
She was baptized at an early age and joined Zion Benevolent Baptist Church in Hopkins, South Carolina, where she served on the Jubilee Choir and was a Missionary Member for over 60 years. She later joined Word of Truth Ministry and Worship Center, there she served on the choir and served actively on the Helping Hands Ministry, until her departure of this life. Her hobbies included sewing, cross-stitching, crocheting, cooking, baking, macramé, traveling, and spending time with her family.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 61 years, James Eugene Daniels Sr; parents, Napoleon and Leila Goodson; brothers, Lester, Napoleon, Jr., Johnson, Robert, and Heyward Goodson; sisters, Leanna Ulmer, Rosa Daniels, Julia Webb, and Janie Bates; son, Peter Anderson; grandson, James Christopher Daniels; and granddaughter Paulette Mullins Quarles.
