# Reflections of the Life of Mother Marian Bookhart Tucker

Mother Marian Bookhart Tucker was born on October 22, 1936, in Columbia, South Carolina. She was the daughter of the late John Marion Bookhart and Ethel Mae Speach. She departed this world where she received abundant life through Jesus Christ to transition into eternal life on Friday, April 12th. Marian is preceded in death by her loving husband, Wilbur Tucker Sr., daughter Lucinda Williams and brothers Breman and John Bookhart.

Mother Tucker, a native of Columbia, was a loving, caring and giving person. She always saw the goodness of God in a person. She attended Richland County public schools and graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in 1954. She earned a bachelor's degree from Benedict College May 1958 and later received her master's degree in Elementary Education from South Carolina State University in 1969.
