Mrs. Ida Taylor Brittingham was born in Sumter, SC, on November 3, 1954 to Lewis Taylor, Sr. and Ida Bell Taylor (Bines). She departed this life on May 13, 2024 in Columbia, SC.

Ida grew up in Sumter, SC, and served in the U.S. Navy after completing High School. She attended Savage Glover Elementary School, Bates Middle School, and graduated from Sumter High School, Class of 1972. Ida also attended Florence Technical College.
