The Legacy of Deacon Joseph Earl Geiger

On October 1, 1946, in Columbia, South Carolina a gift was born to the world in the person of Joseph Earl Geiger. God began writing his story and entrusted him to the late David Geiger, Sr., Annie Ruth Miller-Geiger, and his stepfather, Charles King. In addition to his parents, Joe was preceded in death by his brothers, David Geiger, Jr. and Bobby Geiger; one sister, Mary E. Williams; two sisters-in-law, Mary Louise Adams and Shirley (Charles) Parham; one special nephew, Kenny Geiger; and two goddaughters, Gwendolyn Noble and Michelle Gladman.

Deacon Joseph Earl Geiger was affectionately known as "Joe," to his family and friends. In his early years, Joe played on the Edgewood Little League Team. He was the best first baseman in the state! His competitive spirit led them to winning championships. Joe attended the public schools of Richland County and graduated from C.A. Johnson High School, Class of 1965. During his high school years, Joe was known for being funny and enjoying the company of his seven siblings. He also met the love of his life, Barbara, who rocked his world.

He also volunteered in Richland One and Two School Districts. Joe had a heart for young people. He coached his son's little league baseball team, which won numerous championships and awards. He also coached the Cardinals, his grandchildren's little league baseball team. He continued to coach them into adulthood.

Joe was a loving, talented, funny, and caring person with a big personality. He loved telling jokes, fishing, watching sports and movies, skating, and playing basketball and baseball. He was best known for cooking on his grill, making his "special" chicken, and sharing his gifts with us all. His favorite pastime was sharing memories from his childhood living in Allen-Benedict Court.

Deacon Joseph Earl Geiger shined his light for 77 full years. On May 1, 2024, Joe departed this earthly life and is with our Heavenly Father. Joe lived to laugh, shout, love, DANCE, and brought happiness to all who had the privilege of knowing him.
