Obituary

Mrs. Bernice Naomi Barnwell Manigo was born September 28, 1936, to the late Netha Walker Barnwell and William Henry Barnwell in Bamberg, South Carolina. After a long and remarkably full life, she quietly made her transition to God's eternal rest on Friday, May 31, 2024.

She was united in matrimony to the late Mr. Clyde Manigo of Walterboro, South Carolina. To this union two children were born, Clyde Darius and Monica.

At an early age, Bernice joined Gethsemane Baptist Church in Bamberg County, South Carolina, where she developed her love and devotion to the Lord. Upon moving to Columbia in 1973, she and her family joined the Ridgewood Missionary Baptist Church, where she faithfully taught Sunday school and sang in the Musical Choir. They later went on to join Gill Creek Baptist Church where she served on the Deacon's Board and in the Youth Education Department. Both activities she executed faithfully until her health no longer permitted this work to continue.

Bernice completed her early childhood education in the Bamberg school district and went on the graduate from Richard Carroll High School. She then enrolled in Claflin University where she earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in United States History and Journalism. While at Claflin, she frequently took part in the Civil Rights Movement, marching against the injustices of African Americans. Bernice also found time to pledge her beloved Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., in the spring of 1959, and became a Pearl Soror shortly before her passing, having 65 years in the Sorority. She would continue her education at the University of South Carolina earning a Master's Degree in Education.

Her lifelong career in Education began as a history teacher at Roberts High School in Holly Hill, SC. She was then recruited by Principal Wiley to teach history at Colleton High School in Walterboro, SC. She remained at Colleton High School, until her relocation to Columbia, South Carolina, where she continued to teach until her retirement with a 43-year teaching career. While at Columbia High she served as the Drama Club instructor, teacher to some and Advisor to all who sought her advisement. She was a devoted and loved teacher at her beloved Columbia High School and upon her retirement, the Social Studies Teacher's Lounge was renamed in her honor. Her love of teaching and educating young people, called her out of retirement as she continued to teach at Benedict College for an additional 6 years following the retirement with the Richland School District #1.

If you knew her well, you know that she was always on the go and involved in many different organizations and memberships. She was an active member of the National Education Association, the National Association of University Women, the United Baptist Deacons of Greater Columbia, where she held an executive position, Sunday School teacher and Educator, Benedict College Alumni #2 association club, and a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc, Gamma Nu Omega chapter until she was no longer able to participate.

Bernice was preceded in death by her loving and devoted husband, Mr. Clyde Manigo. She was also preceded by her parents, Mr. William Henry and Mrs. Netha Barnwell; five Brothers, Dolphus Woodard, Carl, Freddie, Clarence and Osborne Barnwell.
