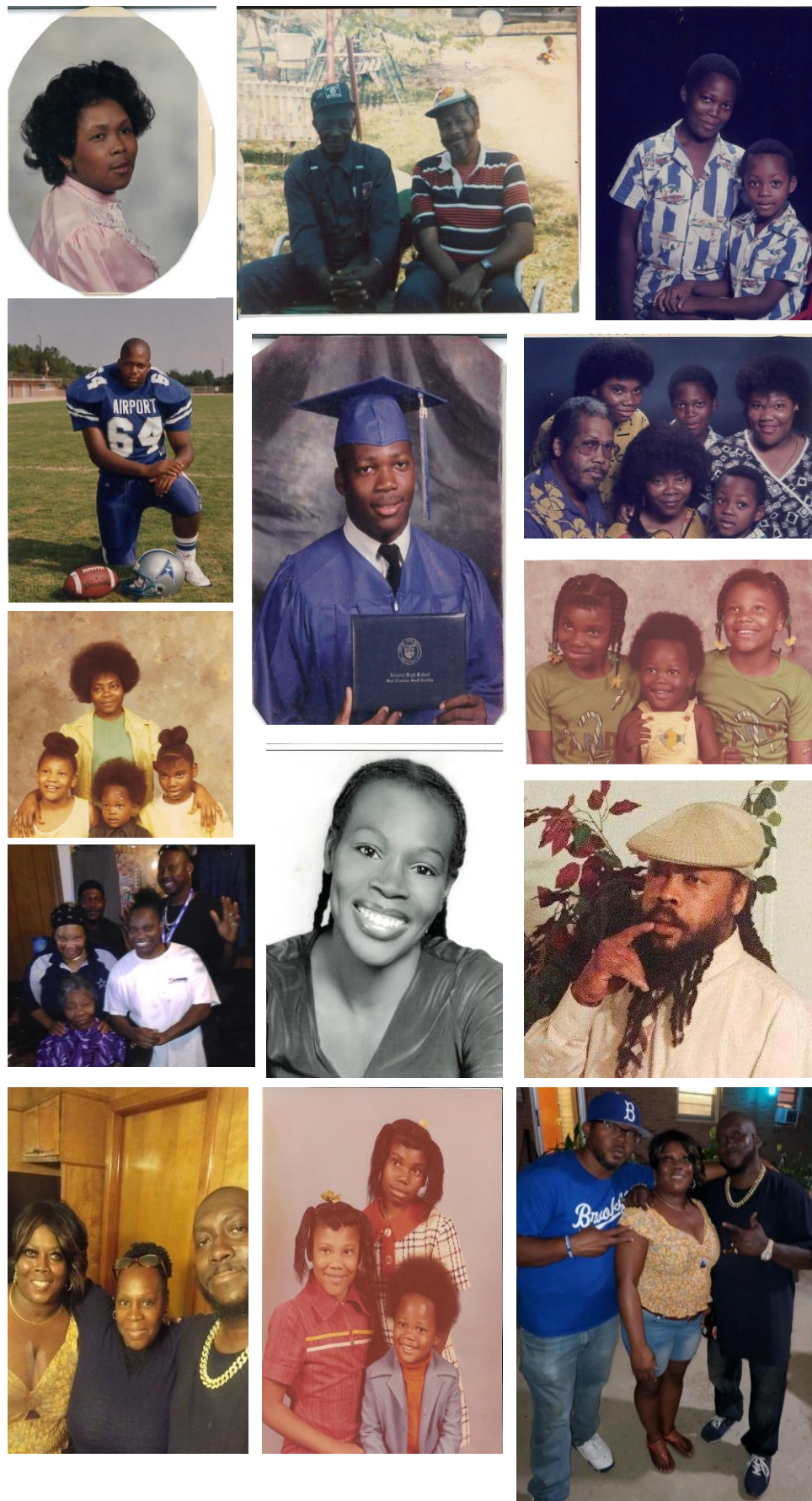
At an early age, Eugene committed his life to Christ. He enjoyed spending time with his family, eating, laughing, playing video games, watching football, basketball, and wrestling.
