Ms. Julia Jackson Tucker was born July 27, 1934, in Saluda, South Carolina to the late Sam and Maxie Campbell Jackson. She departed this life on Thursday, June 20, 2024, at the age of eighty-nine (89).

Ms. Tucker was educated in the public schools of Ridge Hill, in Ridge Springs, South Carolina. She graduated from Twin City High School, in Batesburg, South Carolina.

Ms. Tucker married Mr. Willis Charles Tucker on December 10, 1956, who went home to be with the Lord on June 11, 1991.
