Reflections of the Life of Brother Timothy Tucker

Mr. Timothy "Tim" Tucker son of the late Lewis Tucker and Addie Bell Felder was born January 5, 1942 in Bishopville, SC. He went to be with our Heavenly Father on Wednesday, June 5, 2024, Columbia, SC. Timothy attended primary, middle, and high school in Lee County, South Carolina.

The Progressive Church in Bishopville was started in Timothy's mother Addie Belle Felder's home by Bishop Brakefield. At an early age his family moved to Columbia, SC to attend Progressive Church of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc. "Tim" was baptized on April 19, 1956, and received the holy ghost on October 1, 1956. He was a proud member and served on various auxiliaries and committees including: The Gospel Singers, Usher Board, Senior Choir, and Retired Brothers' Committee.

"Tim" began his journey in the U.S. Army in 1966. His tour of serviced ended in 1968. Mr. Tucker received his certification as an Electrician from Midlands Technical college. 
