

Obituary of Mrs. Merritt Marie Chestnut Reid

Born on February 16, 1929, in Goldsboro, North Carolina, Mrs. Merritt Chestnut Reid did a lot of living, and giving, in her 95 years. She made Columbia, South Carolina her home, near family and friends whom she touched with her grace and charm for decades.

This Golden Bronco was a Class of 1952 graduate of Fayetteville State Teachers College, who dedicated her life's work to improving the lives of children and families in underserved communities where she taught reading, writing, and arithmetic – and maybe just a little bit more. Mrs. Reid often spoke fondly of her days at Fayetteville State Teachers College, which held a special place in her heart because it's where she grew and thrived as a young Black Woman.

After graduation Mrs. Reid accepted a teaching job in the Richland County School System. It was in Columbia, South Carolina that she met her husband, Willie K. Reid, a Georgetown, South Carolina native who was in the military stationed at Fort Jackson and they married in 1956. While stationed abroad with her husband, Mrs. Reid taught in Germany and spent more than three decades in the classroom inspiring young minds and moving generations forward, one step at a time. Along with standard lessons in her classroom, Mrs. Reid shared her gift of love and her passion for art. Mrs. Reid never formally taught art but enrolled in art classes at the University of South Carolina after retiring from Richland County School District One.

In addition to her parents, Mrs. Reid was preceded in death by her husband, Willie K. Reid; her sister, Dorothy Bryant; and brothers, Jessie, James, and Swindell Chestnut, Sr.

Mrs. Merritt Marie Chestnut Reid leaves to mourn her passing and to cherish her precious memory, a special niece, Linda Faye; a host of other loving nieces and nephews.
