

Obituary of Mr. Samuel Morris Corley

Mr. Samuel Morris Corley was born March 9, 1930, in Lexington, South Carolina to the late James Benjamin and Eula Caughman Corley. Mr. Corley graduated from Lakeview High School, in West Columbia, South Carolina in 1947 and 1949. The reason for Mr. Corley's double graduation is due to the SC Public School's mandate that students must receive their high school diploma upon completing their 11<sup>th</sup> grade education. Mr. Corley received his second high school diploma in 1949 upon the completion of the 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Samuel Corley received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Allen University, in 1958 and later received his master's degree, in 1979 from the University of South Carolina.

Mr. Corley enlisted in the United States Army in 1951, where he served as a Military Police while stationed in Yokohama, Japan. While in the service, he prided himself on military grooming, which he carried throughout in his everyday appearance. His primary consideration was to always have a neatly groomed appearance, which contributed to his favorable image.

Mr. Corley was employed as a teacher/assistant football coach at Lakeview High School from the period 1960 – 1964. He was inducted into the Lakeview High School Hall of Fame as an Assistant Coach. Mr. Corley was later employed at Airport High School (Lexington County School District 2) as Teacher/Coach from 1964 through 1992. He retired after 28 years of service.

Mr. Corley joined Turner Memorial A.M.E. Church at a young age. While at Turner Memorial, Mr. Corley participated in Sunday School and the Senior Musical Choir member. As an adult, Mr. Corley was a Sunday School Teacher for the Juniors and Adults, Superintendent of the Sunday School, a Steward Board Member, Steward Emeritus, Trustee, Class Leader President, Co-Chairman of the Finance Committee, a member of the Senior Musical, and Men's Choir. In 1994, Mr. Corley was Turner Memorial's Man of the Year.

Mr. Corley was preceded in death by his loving wife of 56 years, Dorothy Lee Corley; his grandson, Alexander Julian Corley; his brothers, Lawrence (Early), James Benjamin (JB), Talmadge, Calvin and Lester Corley; his sisters: Alberta Blassingale, Majorie Chubb, Delores Ephriam, Barbara Ann Hennigan and Francine Chambers.


