Sister Lucille Epps was born on July 19th, 1925, in Columbia, South Carolina. She was the beloved daughter of the late Deacon Henry and Sister Mary Jane Davis-Reese. Sister Epps was preceded in death by six sisters and one brother.

Sister Lucille Epps was married to the late Mr. Wardell Epps, Sr., on May 5, 1941. This blessed union lasted 44 years until his transition into eternity in 1986. To this union ten (10) healthy children were born. She also reared four (4) grandchildren, Thomas, Tracey, Bryant and LaBruce as her own.

Sister Lucille Epps attended the public schools of Richland County, S.C. She was honored for her dedicated service to the Benedict College Child Development Center (CDC) as a Foster Grandparent on April 30, 1999.

Sister Lucille Epps had a green thumb when it came to maintaining greenhouse plants. They were amazing to behold. Her skill was evident with day lilies, amaryllis, azaleas and with annuals too. The kitchen was her domain. She enjoyed preparing, cooking and presenting the meal to her family and others, especially for her Pastors. Some of the dishes they raved over were her collard greens, corn bread stuffing, biscuits, pound cake and her infamous sweet potato Umh Umh. She knew how to stretch a meal/pot to accommodate all at the table. "Mother," as Gerald called her; enjoyed listening to Sunday morning worship at Antioch Baptist Church and afterward she listened to Brother Jimmy Swaggert's gospel singing services with her sister Mary Ann. There were two sayings that Sister Epps coined when family or friends were departing in person or on the phone, "I love you more!" and "Hold it in the road!"
