Obiluary of Mrs. Beverly Jean Goodwin Jackson

Mrs. Beverely Jean Goodwin Jackson was born on March 2, 1943, to the late Thomas and Elizabeth Goodwin. She departed this life on Thursday, September 19, 2024

Educated in the public schools of Richland County, South Carolina, Beverly attended C.A. Johnson High School, where she was a member of the Johnsonaires and the Casuals Social Club. She later attended Booker T. Washington High School, graduating in 1961. While at Booker T. Washington High School, Beverly was a member of the The Thespians (Theater Group), Political Campaign Manager/Announcer for Franchot A. Brown's Student Council Campaign, and a member of the Political Debate Club. As a young child, Beverly performed at the Palmetto Theatre in downtown Columbia with the Mickey Mouse Club (which at the time, only allowed Black people to audition once a month while others performed the other Saturdays.)

Beverly attended South Carolina State College, then later relocated to New York City. While in New York, she was employed with Macy's. Beverly was selected to be a part of the annual Macy's Day Parade, the second oldest Thanksgiving Day parade in the United States. She was a social butterfly and made friends wherever she went. Beverly later became employed with New York Telephone Company, Pacific Bell (El Monte, California), and retired from AT&T (Columbia, SC), after 26 years of impeccable service. After retiring, Beverly still had a passion to work. She then found employment with Johnson, Toal, and Battiste, P.A., in Columbia, SC.

In 2009, Beverly with the help of some of her lifelong friends, spearheaded a fundraiser to publish a calendar titled, "Classic Calander Ladies." The group was dedicated to promoting the empowerment of women in their community through breast cancer awareness. The ladies featured in the calendar expressed personal stories related to Breast Cancer. Some were survivors, while others had relatives and friends who succumbed to the disease as the result of early detection not being accessible or an option. The group raised \$5,000 and donated the funds to the Best Chance Network, which allowed 23 women to receive Breast Cancer and Cervical screenings. Their vision and dedication to this project was successful.

In addition to her parents, Beverly was preceded in death by her husband, Leroy Jackson and two brothers, Thomas Goodwin and Rayford Goodwin.
