

Obituary of Mr. Morman Tyrone Moore

Mr. Norman Tyrone Moore was the second of four children born to the late Wallace and late Ethel Gordon Moore on December 21, 1946. He peacefully departed this earthly life on Monday, September 23, 2024, at Springdale Health Center.

He attended Richland County, South Carolina public schools and was a proud 1964 graduate of C. A. Johnson High School. Norman also attended classes at Allen University. He was baptized at an early age at New Ebenezer Baptist Church.

In the mid to late 60s, he participated in the civil rights movement as a member of the NAACP's Youth Division. He marched, alongside his brother, Bernard, in many protests and sit-ins in the city of Columbia. He took pride in traveling to Washington, DC, where he witnessed Martin Luther King give the historic speech at the March on Washington.

Norman owned and operated Moore's Cleaners for more than 30 years. He worked alongside his parents and brothers for many years, before managing his own plant in the Haskell Heights Community and satellite locations on Fairfield Road and Taylor Street.

He was an avid lover of cars, particularly classic and hot rods. This love allowed him to work as a sales representative at Jim Moore Cars in the 1980s. He also sold cars as an independent contractor and was a collector of various car makes and models.

He thoroughly loved drag racing. As a young man, he took pride in having the "fastest car" around the city of Columbia. He won numerous awards for his prowess on the racetrack. As a young man and into adulthood, he could be found at racetracks in Orangeburg and Florence, South Carolina as well as North Carolina. His love of the sport, before his illness, took him on many Sundays to professional drag and Nascar races.

With a gregarious spirit, he was always the life of the party. Norman enjoyed laughing, telling jokes, and simply having a good a time. You could always find him in his "man cave" entertaining friends and family.

In addition to his parents, Norman was preceded in death by his wife, Barbara Moore, and his brothers, Arthur Bernard, Wallace Alonzo, and Petro Arnold.
