The angel said my place was ready in heaven far above And that I'd have to leave behind all those I dearly love.


But when I walked through Heaven's gate, I felt so much at home When God looked down and smiled at me from His great golden throne.

Obituary of Mr. Robert "Bob" Gordon Reynolds, Jr.

Mr. Robert Gordon Reynolds, Jr. was born February 17, 1934, in Greenwood, South Carolina. He was the only child of Robert Reynolds, Sr. and Beatrice Adams Reynolds. He transitioned from this life on Tuesday, September 17, 2024.

Mr. Robert "Bob" Gordon Reynolds, Jr., affectionately known as "Coach," was educated in the public schools of Greenwood County, South Carolina and graduated from Brewer High School. He was drafted into the United States Army at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, and served in the Korean War. After his tour of service ended, he made Columbia, South Carolina his home.

Bob played football and earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Claflin College in Orangeburg, South Carolina. He then matriculated to North Carolina A&T State University in Greensboro, North Carolina where he earned a Master of Science - Education degree. He was a faithful member and Lay Minister at the Good Shepherd Episcopal Church in Columbia, South Carolina. A 2008 inductee of the South Carolina Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame, "Bob" enjoyed most sports, especially golf. He was a proud member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, having been initiated though the Delta Alpha chapter in the Spring of 1952 and was recently honored as a South Carolina "Living Legend" by the organization.

Bob coached at Booker T. Washington High School in Columbia, South Carolina where he won championships in football ('64, '68, '69) and basketball ('61, '62, '63). He also coached at AC Flora High School in Columbia, South Carolina where he won championships in Girls Track ('79, '80), Boys Track ('79, '87) and Boys Cross Country ('80). He has numerous additional honors and awards, too many to list here. After retirement in 1999, he continued to follow South Carolina high school sports and loved spending time with family and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Robert Reynolds, Sr. and Beatrice Adams Reynolds.
