## Obituary of Mr. Jake Williams, Jr.

Mr. Jake Williams, Jr., age 69, transitioned peacefully at his home in Columbia, South Carolina, on Saturday, September 23, 2024. Born on August 10, 1955, to the late Jake Williams Sr. and Alma Sharpe, Jake was known for his charismatic personality, and his ability to light up any room he entered.

He attended Beaufort High School, where he was an all-star running back, who carried his passion for sports into his life beyond school. In 1972, he enlisted in the United States Army, where he served his country with honor and dedication.

After his military service, Jake embraced his entrepreneurial spirit by founding Edifice Artist, a small business that provided custom painting services for residential and commercial clients. He skillfully balanced his professional life with his cherished roles as a husband, father, uncle and father-like figure to many.

In 2004, Jake became a transplant recipient, which inspired him to become an advocate of Life Point, in support of organ donations. He traveled throughout South Carolina, educating others on the importance of organ donation and raising awareness about the lifesaving impact it could have. His commitment to this cause was recognized when he won two bronze medals in the long jump at the Transplant Games, in 2006.

In 2008, driven by his faith and desire to give back, Jake founded the Bottom Up Trust Fund, a nonprofit organization dedicated to teaching underprivileged children the importance of saving and financial literacy. His passion for helping others and empowering youth was evident in all he did.

Jake is survived by his beloved wife, Vivian Williams, with whom he shared 41 wonderful years; two sons, Patrick (Thekla) Meny and Trevis (Jennifer) Pitt; three daughters, Karman (Kenneth) Pusha, Xyvina (William) Williams-Matthews, and Accorvia (Jose) Lopez; his brother, Ronald (Erlinda) Sharpe; four granddaughters; one grandson; along with a host of nieces, nephews, and cousins, all who will miss him dearly.

Jake's vibrant spirit, unwavering love for his family, and commitment to helping others will be remembered by all who knew him.
