I promise no tomorrow but today will always last And since each day's the same day, there's no longing for the past.



Mr. Curnie Hargrove III, affectionately known as "Dr. Stretch" to family and friends, transitioned from this life to eternal rest on Wednesday, October 23, 2024, after a brave battle with cancer. Born in Harlem, New York, Curnie was the beloved third child of Shirley Elaine Evans Hargrove and Curnie Hargrove Jr.

Raised on 139th Street, Curnie attended New York City public schools and graduated from Louis D. Brandeis High School. He continued his education at Marymount Manhattan College before serving honorably in the U.S. Army. Later, he relocated to South Carolina, where he worked as a bus driver in Columbia and eventually as a charter bus driver with Peterson Charters and Tours, a role that brought him immense joy.

An athlete in his youth, Curnie excelled in basketball, baseball, football, and paddleball. His basketball prowess earned him the nickname "Dr. Stretch," given by a close friend, a title he carried with pride throughout his life. He was also a talented dancer, winning several contests alongside his sister, and a singer, known for his heartfelt renditions of "Happy Birthday" that became a treasured family tradition.

Curnie was a member of Bibleway Church, where he shared his love for music by singing in the choir. Known for his green thumb, he took pride in maintaining his own yard and often helped beautify the yards of friends and family.
