Obituary

Mr. Lonnie Elijah Overby was born on June 23, 1931, in Oxford, North Carolina to the parents of Earnest and Nancy Overby. He was educated in the Oxford Public School System. He worked on his father's farm with his siblings growing tobacco and other vegetables in his youth. After graduating from high school, Lonnie sought employment opportunities outside of North Carolina and received permission from his father to move to Jersey City, NJ. After staying briefly with a family member, Lonnie found employment working as a longshoreman, in Jersey City. He later moved to Spring Valley, New York, where he began working at the Rockland Psychiatric Center, (formerly known as Rockland State Hospital until 1970) in Orangeburg, NY.

Lonnie worked tirelessly at Rockland, and it was where he also met Mable Elizabeth Thorne. They married on July 5, 1959, in Bronx, NY. They worked hard to save and purchase their first home in Spring Valley, NY. There they joined and faithfully attended The First Baptist Church of Spring Valley. They both worked at Rockland Psychiatric Center, until retirement in 1989. After retiring, they moved to the St. Marks Community, of Columbia, South Carolina.

During visits back and forth from Spring Valley, NY to Columbia, SC, Lonnie and Mable became members of First Nazareth Baptist Church, Columbia, SC, and have remained faithful for 54 years. After joining, Lonnie immediately followed his passion and began singing with the Men's Brotherhood Choir. He often said, not only were they a men's choir, but they were also a "true brotherhood." He also enjoyed joining Pastor Scott in traveling to other churches to sing at many Christian special events. Lonnie was an avid fisherman and went on various fishing outings with family, friends and church members.

During his time at First Nazareth, Lonnie received several appreciation awards, was a member of the Sunshine Gardening and Senior Ministries. Both he and Mable were members of the Couple's Ministry.
