
You Did Not Go Alone





Obituary

Lived, Loved and Cherished

On Saturday, January 11, 2025, Anthony Tyrone Peterson passed from death unto life.

Anthony affectionately called by his middle name Tyrone and Pete by his friends was born on March 2, 1960 to the late Diana Peterson in Columbia, South Carolina.

Tyrone loved life, his family and friends. He was educated in the public schools of Richland County, South Carolina and graduated from C. A. Johnson High School, Class 1978. He joined the United States Army at Fort Jackson in May 1979 and served in stateside as well as overseas assignments. He was a Petroleum Specialist. He completed his enlistment on November 29, 1984. He returned home from the Army and was employed with the South Carolina Department of Disabilities and Special Needs from May 14, 1987 to June 14, 1991, where individuals with disabilities lived and are cared for by dedicated staff. Afterwards, Tyrone would begin working with Lourie's Department Store first as a Supply Specialist and then moved to become a Salesman in the Men's Department where he acquired a taste for fine clothing. He was known for his style that radiated coolness and confidence. His family and friends started looking to him for advice on styles. He would later leave his previous employment and on 9 December 1996, he joined Richland County School District 1 as a Custodial Supervisor and retired from the School District on July 1, 2022.

Tyrone confessed the Lord Jesus Christ as his Savior at New Ebenezer Baptist Church, Columbia, SC. He served as a Deacon, worked with the Jesus Army of Young Saints which focused on outreach and evangelism to young people, sung with the Youth and Musical Choirs, attended Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. On January 13, 2013, he became a member of First Nazareth Baptist Church, Columbia, SC. There he served faithfully with the Culinary Ministry providing support and services to all ministries at First Nazareth. This ministry fit him well as he was passionate about his art of cooking and serving.

Tyrone loved working in the yard and cooking and found many benefits to doing both. He was skilled at identifying different plants and bushes, and making delicious dishes that brought you back for more. He learned both skills from his Mother. Tyrone loved his Miami Dolphins. He took joy in acting up with his family and friends, storytelling and giving people nicknames. He had a way of turning a frown into a smile with anyone with his infectious laughter that was uplifting.

He was preceded in death by his Mother, Diane Peterson, Aunts, Margaret Robinson, Leola Thomas, Nunella Brennan, Clara Mathews, Kathryn Davis, his Uncles, Rev. J. Alfred Peters and Samuel Peterson and his special Cousin who was more of a Sister, Dana Peterson.
