Obituary of Mrs. Deborah Carlson Boone

Mrs. Deborah Carlson Boone was born on May 27, 1957, to the late Walter F. and Bessie Johnson Carlson. She departed this life and took her earthly rest on Thursday, February 13, 2025. She was preceded in death, her husband, David E. Boone; and two brothers, Walter F. Carlson III, and Allan B. Carlson.

Deborah attended Guilford County Public Schools and graduated from James B. Dudley High School in 1975. In 1979, she graduated from North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, where she received her bachelor's degree in psychology. She was initiated into the Alpha Mu Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated in Spring 1977. She later received her master's degree from North Carolina A&T in Agency Counseling.

During her time at North Carolina A&T, she met her husband David Boone, and they were married on January 28, 1984. From this union, one son was born, David Eugene Boone, Jr.

Deborah was a committed advocate of underserved populations and served as the Coordinator of the McKinney Vento Program, which ensures that students who are homeless are receiving educational and support services. It was in this position that Deborah discovered her true passion. In her 25 plus years in the position and because of expertise with the homeless population Deborah featured in national publications, testified on capitol hill and served in various capacities including as a board member of the National Association for the Education of Homeless Children. As a board member Deborah's contributions impacted how homeless students were served across the country. In addition to her accomplishments at the national level, Deborah was known in the Midlands for her work on behalf of the homeless, partnering with a variety of public and private agencies from the United Way of the Midlands to

Faith Based Organizations. Her most recent accomplishment involved a collaboration with the NAACP to create Housing

Clinics to assist families in having a place to call home. Under Deborah's leadership thousands of students and families were served and lives made better. Deborah loved her work and was known across Richland One for teaming with departments to secure resources for her beloved population of students.

Deborah loved God and would freely let those experiencing hardships know that she was praying for them. In her time away from work, Deborah was an excellent host who enjoyed spending time with family and friends. Like most members of her family, she had a deep love of music and if you stopped by her house she would often be found listening to her favorite artists and having a cup of "coffee." Deborah was an excellent cook with "secret recipes" to share with only a special few. She had a lively "spirit" ready to tackle whatever the day would bring from a day of shopping with the girls, a night out with friends or just being home. She appreciated the gift of life and the people in her life.

Deborah leaves many friends and family to cherish her memory.
