








Reflections of the Life of Mrs. Ernestine Edmands James







"Momma," "Grannie," "Auntie," "Ernest," "Ms. J," and "Cuz," as she was affectionately called by family and friends, was educated in the public schools of Richland County and attended Booker T. Washington High School when they were graduating students in the 11th grade. She was employed by many businesses in the Columbia area, Eckerd Drugs Store, W.A. Perry Jr. High School, but worked the longest at Department of Mental Health, in the Bakery and Dietary Services. She was a dedicated worker until she retired on June 30, 1990.
