Obituary of Mr. Isaiah Wright

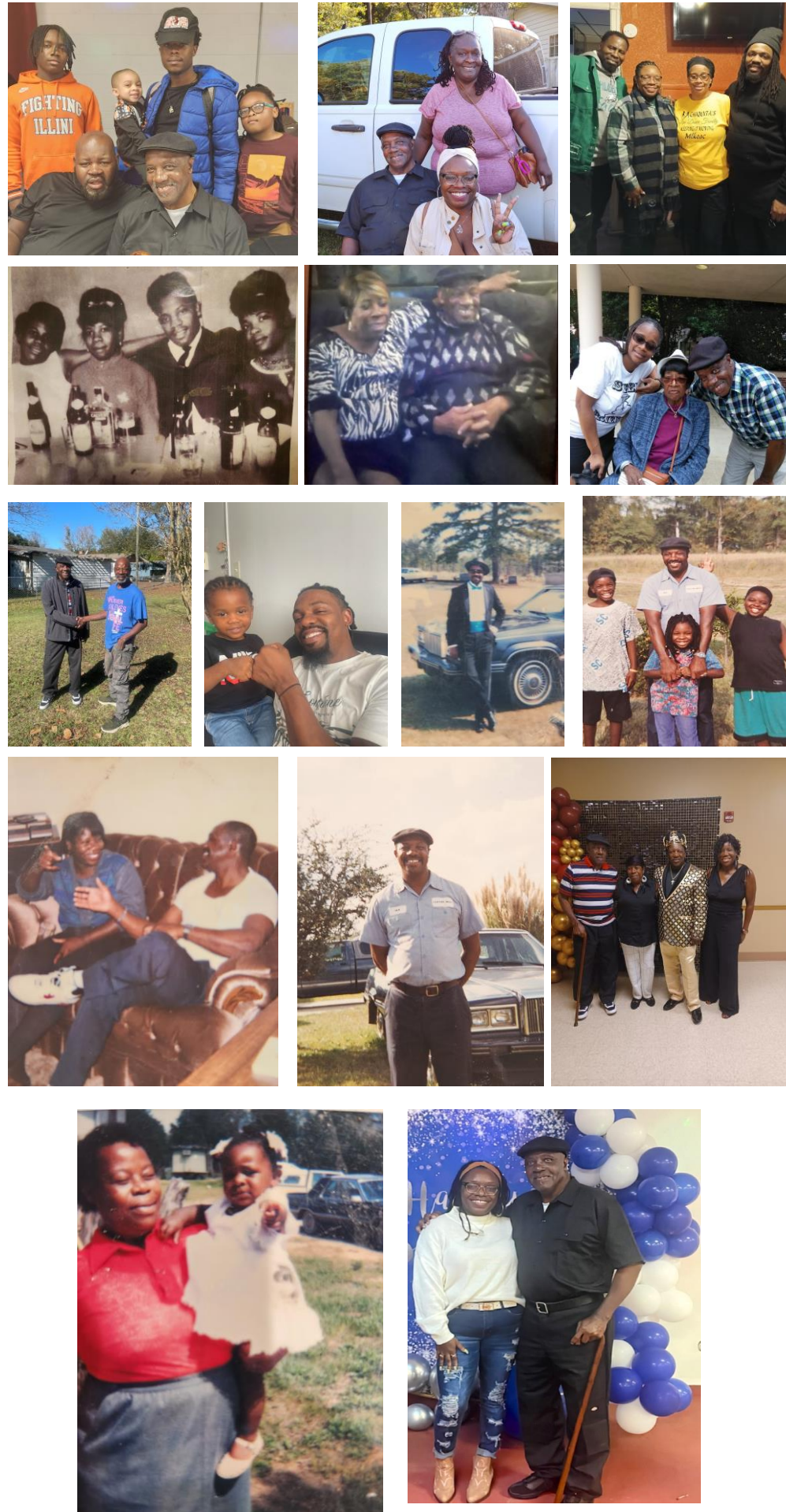
