

Obituary of Mrs. Early Lee Roger Mack

Mrs. Early Cooper Mack was born on June 30, 1925, on a plantation in Johnsonville, South Carolina. She and her brother were raised by their mother and grandfather.

At the age of 13, Early was married to Nelson Mack and became a mother at the tender age of 16. Their union was blessed with six children, Ellen, Mary Frances, Nelson, Jr., Jesses, Laverne, and a son Daniel who was stillborn at birth.

Early dedicated her life to Christ at an early age, at her home church in Williamsburg County, South Carolina. She preached her trial sermon in 1949, in Nashville, Tennessee. Early chose not to be ordained because as a result she would have to leave her family and traveled when needed and wherever needed. Leaving her husband and small children were not an option.

In 1954, Early along with her husband and family relocated to Columbia, South Carolina, where she became a member of Bible Way Church for 30 years. Realizing that God had more for her to do, she because a member of Word of Life. While at Word of Life, she also attended the Word of Life Bible Institute. Nelson worked as a mechanic, while Early enjoyed crocheting and sewing but most of all taking care of her family. She also enjoyed working in he garden, reading book, singing, and spending time with God.

Seeing the need to further her education, Early graduated from the Richland County School District 2 Adult Education Program. She dedicated 21 years of service to the nursing field; working at the Babcock Center, the old Columbia Hospital, and Baptist Medical Center. After retiring, Early was unable to just sit at home. She began volunteering at the daycare center of Word of Life World Outreach Ministries, later becoming a Lead Teaching Assistant, Teacher, and Coordinator of the Infant Center from 1992-2002.
