Mr. Eli Richardson was born September 26,1930, in Lee County, South Carolina. He was the son of the late Elias and Lizzie Dora Felder Richardson. He departed this life Wednesday, April 9, 2025. Preceding his death was his wife of 54 years Mrs. Viola Richardson and his siblings, Ethel Tillman, Almeta Watts, Samuel Richardson, Sylvester Richardson, Elease Moses, Margaret Williams, Dora Willis, and Randolph Richardson.

Mr. Eli Richardson received his formal education at Mather Academy in Camden, SC. He attended Allen University, in Columbia, SC, until he was drafted to serve in the U.S. Armed Forces (the Korean War). He served with pride and dedication within the Leadership Academy of the Army.

Mr. Richardson's unwavering commitment to education led him to complete his college degree. He graduated from Benedict College in 1958, with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Biology. After college, his passion for education inspired him to become a middle school science teacher in the Lee County School District. He never stopped learning and challenging himself and others. He successfully passed the Civil Service Exam and commenced his employment with the U.S. Postal Service. Mr. Richardson dedicated 30 years of service to the U.S. Postal Service, retiring in 1990.

Mr. Richardson frequently emphasized that the civil rights issue was the foremost challenge of his time. He became a member of NAACP and subsequently dedicated his time and energy to the movement advocating change.

Through his involvement with the NAACP and the Voting Rights initiative, Mr. Richardson met his wife to be Mrs. Viola P. Byrd, who shared his commitment to these causes. They were married on February 6, 1969. They remained actively engaged in Civil Rights activities throughout their lives, advocating for equal rights, and the importance of voting and voicing one's opinions until their passing. He was a community organizer for the Byrneswood Community, the Felder family reunion, and director of the Richardson family reunion. Most importantly he was a husband, a father, grandfather, uncle, cousin, neighbor, and son of God.

Mr. Eli Richardson leaves to cherish his memories five children, Tracy Dean Richardson of Columbia, SC, Linda Snead of Columbia, SC; James Peter Byrd, Jr (Lenzena) of Columbia, SC; Paula Barnette (Rufus) of Charlotte, NC; and Marty Byrd of Atlanta, GA; fourteen grandchildren, twelve great-grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, other family members, and friends.
