Mr. Benjamin Stearns Sr., affectionately known as “Bunny Boy,” was born on May 22, 1938, in Columbia, South Carolina. He was the oldest of ten children of the late Pauline “Granny” Stearns. He departed this life on Monday, May 5, 2025.
