Obituary of Mrs. Rosa Lee Robinson Goodwin

Mrs. Rosa Lee Robinson Goodwin, affectionately known as *Nancy*, was born on January 18, 1945, in Pinewood, South Carolina. She was raised in the Ward One Community - "White Town" area. *Nancy* was the daughter of the late Elliott Robinson and Carrie Mae Green-Robinson. She departed this life on Friday, May 30, 2025. Her final moments were spent peacefully in her home, surrounded by family and close friends.

Nancy was known for always speaking her mind and by her generous nature for helping others. She received her adult high school diploma in 1976 from Richland School District 2 Adult High School. *Nancy* worked at various manufacturing textile mills (Sunner, Olympia, and Allied Chemical) in her early years. She became a licensed insurance agent in 1987 and worked for NBSC Bank in Bank Card Collections for six years in 1988. *Nancy* also received her cosmetology license in 1988, while attending Chris Logan School of Cosmetology. In 1994, she worked as a rural carrier for the Columbia Postal Service for approximately five years in 1994.

Nancy found joy in baking cakes in her spare time; her pound cakes were out of this world. She lived a life filled with purpose and determination. She had a strong work ethic but took "no mess" from the jobs. *Nancy* had a variety of slogans she would say, her favorite was, "make it do, what it do!"

She was a member of Emmanuel Tabernacle of the Lord Jesus Christ, under the leadership of Pastor Robert Sumter. Her faith in God was unwavering. We ask that Rosa "Nancy" to be remembered for the joy she brought to others in life, not the sadness of her passing.
