Obituary of Mr. Joe Nathan Jones

Mr. Joe Nathan Jones was born on September 8, 1950, in Columbia, South Carolina, to the late Joe W. and Rodella Jones. On Tuesday, June 3, 2025, Joe's earthly journey came to a peaceful close. His legacy of love, laughter, and loyalty will remain in the hearts of those who knew and loved him.

He was educated in the public school system of Richland County, and graduated from C.A. Johnson High School, Class of 1968. After graduation, he answered the call to serve his country and enlisted in the United States Air Force. Following his honorable military service, Joe dedicated many years of his life to serving others through his work at the South Carolina State Mental Health Hospital, where he later retired.
