Reflections of the Life of Mrs. Peggy Swanson Mitchell

Mrs. Peggy Swanson Mitchell was born January 7, 1929, in Maybeury, West Virginia -- the third of eight daughters to the late Thomas and Ruth Johnson Swanson. On Saturday May 31, 2025, in overnight stillness and surrounded by her devoted son, Peggy very peacefully answered her call from labor to reward.

At age eight Peggy moved to nearby Bluefield, Virginia and graduated from Graham Colored High School in 1945. After working in Bluefield two years Peggy began studying at Bluefield (WV) State College and graduated in 1951 with a dual degree in French and Spanish.

Next Peggy chose to explore beyond Bluefield in New York and Connecticut. She also earned a scholarship for a master's program at the University of Iowa, but a misaddressed 1954 letter from a C.A. Johnson High School French teacher amazingly still arrived at her Brooklyn address to foster a move to Columbia, the town she thoroughly enjoyed as home for more than 70 years.

In 1962 she married fellow West Virginia native Ernest Mitchell and was widowed upon his death in 1978. The union produced one son, Ernest, Jr.

Peggy enjoyed teaching six, nine, and twenty years at C.A. Johnson, Booker T. Washington, and Dreher High Schools, respectively. She also enjoyed offering adjunct instruction at the Allen-Benedict Summer School (1955) and again at Benedict College (1990-1992). In the middle of her teaching career, she earned that master's degree from the University of South Carolina (1971). Peggy loved helping students, but did not stress self-recognition. When she received Dreher High's Teacher of the Year award (1985), her son labored to convince her to accept the honor.

After retiring from teaching Peggy focused several years on volunteering for literacy. She loved reading and helping others do the same -- especially mature Ukrainian immigrants studying for the U.S. citizenship exam

Peggy was an active member of First Calvary Baptist Church since shortly after arriving in Columbia. In the 1970s she became one of the earliest women to serve as church trustees. In 1973 she began her 46 years of teaching the Young Adults' Sunday school class; later named the Mixed Adults' class.

Around 2005 she realized that little archiving and physical documentation remained in the church and undertook a broad-church history project with Mrs. Lena Danner. She visited the South Carolina Archives, various local libraries, and consulted local journalists to help secure historical pieces of First Calvary; and additional records and documents for the church.

Though the presence of one so dear is no more, a legacy of love will forever be felt in the hearts of her loving and devoted son Ernest E. Mitchell; special niece and nephew, Lisa Palmer and Donald "Pete" Swanson; other nieces, nephews and a host of loving relatives and dear friends all who will miss her dearly.
