Sister Carol Brown-Muhammad (Sheba) was the seventh child, born October 25, 1952, in Columbia, South Carolina to the late Ernest and Eula Coe White. She returned to Allah on Saturday, September 6, 2025, in Columbia, South Carolina. She was preceded in death by her late husband, Mr. Elston Wayne Brown; son, Ismail Warith; and six siblings, Patricia Allen, Lubba “Linda” Rahman, David White, Pamela White Hutto, Leroy White, and Gloria Dean White Kinard.

Sister Carol attended Voorhees University in Denmark, South Carolina in the early 2000’s. She was a lovely singer, an avid reader, had an extreme love of learning and could fix just about anything! She had a genuine adoration for her chickadees (children). She was a member of the Black Panther party for a short stint in her early 20’s, volunteering with the feeding of the children in the local community in Richmond, VA. At the age of 22 she was introduced to the Teachings of the Most Honorable Elijah Muhammad from seeing Message To The Black Man on a friend’s coffee table and asking to borrow the book. After an endless night of reading and weeping for she knew this was the truth she longed for, she hurriedly went to her local Mosque in Washington, D.C. and accepted her own and began her process of becoming a registered member of the Nation of Islam. Her letter passed in August of 1974. With the zeal that this Invincible Truth brings to any true believer, she made haste to share the teachings with her siblings. Certainly, grateful to Allah for now having four generations of family becoming members of the Nation of Islam.

Sister Carol was devoted to spreading the Teachings of the Most Honorable Elijah Muhammad as it is now taught to us through The Honorable Minister Louis Farrakhan.
