Obituary of Mr. Ernest Mitchell

Mr. Ernest Mitchell was born February 20, 1949, in Columbia, South Carolina. He was the fourth child of the late Lawrence Mitchell and Victoria Baxley Mitchell. He departed this life on Monday, October 27, 2025.

Mr. Mitchell was educated in the public schools of Richland County, South Carolina, and graduated from Booker T. Washington High School, Class of 1968.
