Obituary

Mr. Percy Morant, Sr. was born on September 1, 1949, in Holly Hill, South Carolina to the late Mack and Jannie Morant. On January 8, 2026 after a prolonged illness, God called him home to rest with the Lord. He was 76 and passed away peacefully with his loving wife and son by his side.

At a young age, Percy joined Greater Target AME Church, in Holly Hill, South Carolina and accepted Christ as his savior. As a child, Percy attended the public schools of Holly Hill, South Carolina. Graduating from Roberts High school in 1967. Percy was gifted with many talents, playing football for a moment, then moving on to be drum major with the high school band. After graduating, Percy was drafted to serve in the United States Army after being enrolled in college for 2 years. While in the army his military occupational specialty was Military Police. He was stationed in Vietnam from 1969 to 1971. After returning home from the war he was awarded a certificate of appreciation from Commander -in-Chief, Richard Nixon for his honorable service to his country. He also received a Certificate of Appreciation for his active service in the United States Army, from the General , W.C. Westmoreland, Chief of Staff.

In 1971, Percy was released from active duty and transferred to the United States Army Reserve. He then returned to Voorhees College to complete his collegiate studies, earning a Bachelor's of Science degree in Business Administration. He then attended Midlands Technical College, an earned his Associate's degree in Criminal Justice.

On April 20, 1974 he was joined in holy matrimony to Maxine Sullivan Bryant. They celebrated fifty-one years of marriage last year. This union was blessed with two children.

Percy's career was marked by his hard work, passion and dedication of service to his Country, public service as well as education. His professional work career began at the Department of Juvenile Justice, at one of their long-term institutional facilities, John G. Richard School for boys. He later left and went to Pic-n-Pay Shoe Store, where he was the manger over the store location for years. Even then Percy's outstanding work ethic, was awarded and highlighted for his outstanding sales, service, and having top performing store in retail. He was also employed by Richland School District One where he served for many years as a Substitute Teacher at Eau Claire High school, and also worked with school nutrition central kitchen. Throughout his life, he always tried to keep busy and work multiple jobs. Percy was not afraid to take on anything, doing yard work, working with a friend of the family cleaning services, and even construction work. He was also a brick mason and assisted with the building of senior facility Marion High Rise in downtown Columbia. He retired from the United States Postal Service as a postal worker.

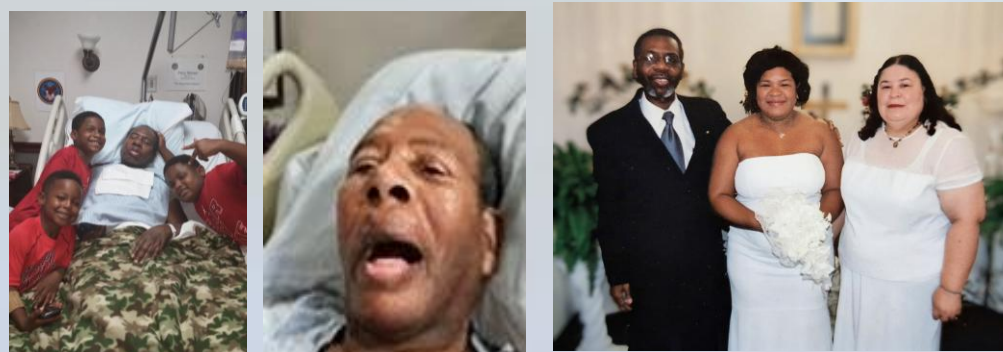
