Mr. Richard Allen Brennan was born on December 8, 1940, in Yonkers, NY. He was the oldest child of the late Freida Richmond and William Brennan. Mr. Brennan was called home to be with the Lord, on Sunday, February 22, 2026.

Mr. Brennan was educated in the public schools of Yonkers, New York. He continued his education through college studies. Mr. Brennan joined the United States Army in 1962. He served several tours during the Vietnam War. Mr. Brennan was an Air Borne Ranger along with being a flight navigator on the Chinook Helicopter. He retired as a decorated Sergeant First Class (SFC), in 1986. Mr. Brennan's hard work didn't stop there, he went on to work as a Human Resource Representative with Bush Gardens in Williamsburg, Virginia before relocating to Columbia, South Carolina.

At an early age Mr. Brennan practiced the Catholic Faith, later becoming an Episcopalian.

In addition to his parents, Mr. Brennan was preceded in death by his both of his brothers, Roger and Hayward Brennan.
