Obituary of Mr. Henry Thomas Edmond

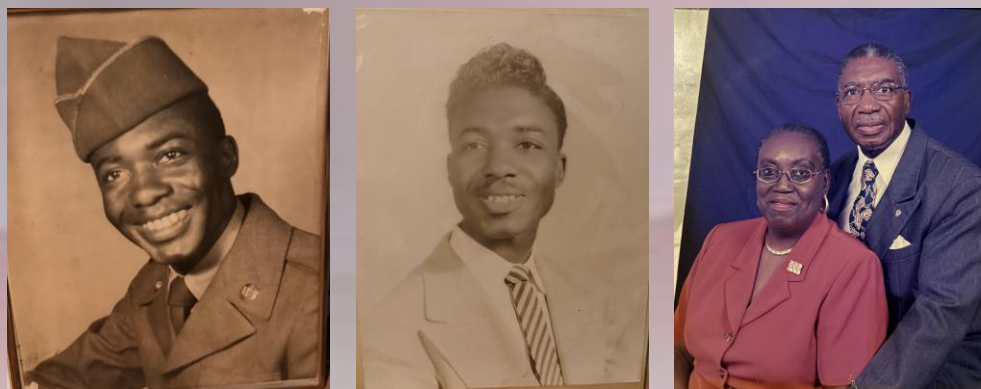
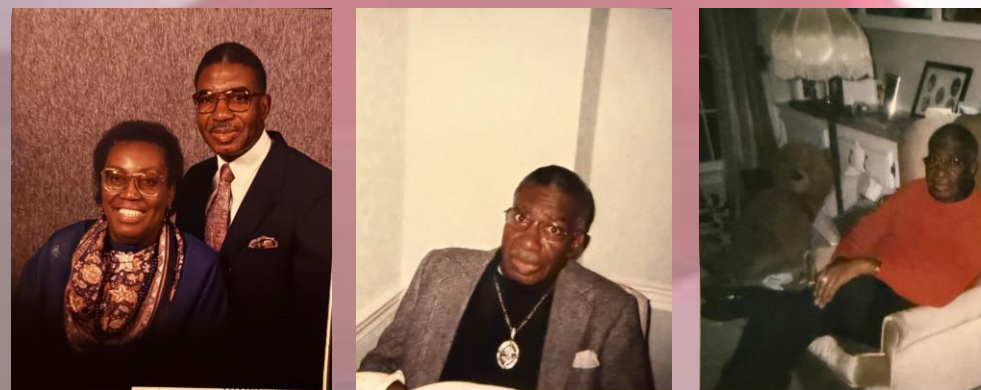
