Reflections of the Life of Mrs. Olly Mae Worthy Taylor

Mrs. Olly Mae Worthy Taylor was born on October 17, 1931, to the late Hughy Worthy, Sr. and Carrie Miles Worthy, in Columbia, South Carolina. She departed this earthly life on Sunday, March 1, 2026, at home surrounded by her loving family.

Olly was raised in the Worthy Family where Christian values were instilled in the home and Olly's father held bible study often. She accepted Christ as her Savior early in life. Olly attended Gill Creek Baptist Church, where she served as an usher. Her passion was praising God in song on the Jubilee Choir. She sang on the Jubilee Choir as long as her health permitted her too.

Her early education began at Monteith School, one of the oldest black public schools in Richland County. Olly was a graduate of Booker T. Washington High School as a part of their first senior class. After high school, she continued her education at Mather Academy, Camden, South Carolina.

Olly was joined in holy matrimony to the late Grady McCaskill, and to their union two sons, Stanley McCaskill and Herman McCaskill were born, with whom she was very devoted. For a short span, they relocated to Ohio and later returned to Columbia, South Carolina.

Surprising the whole family, Olly later married her childhood friend, Booker T. Taylor, with the two-finding love after many years. She was employed as a housekeeper for many years and was a life-long caregiver for many including her parents, husband, and siblings. Olly lived a life of selflessness to all who needed it.

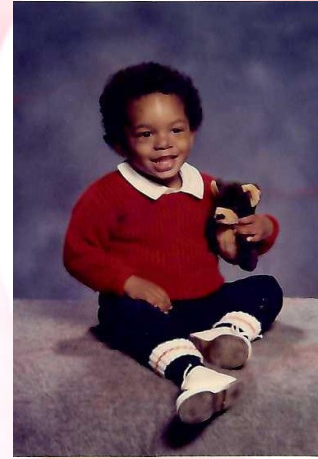
