My Love,

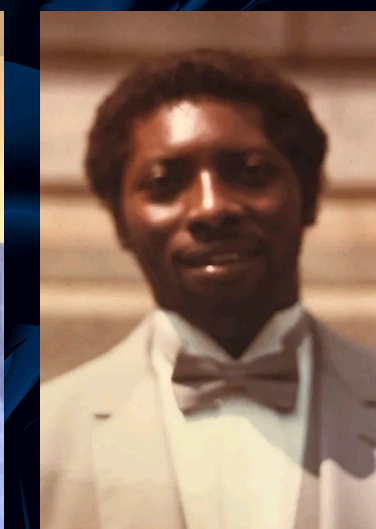
